Ethical charter UNESCO chair Global Health & Education

The UNESCO Chair Global Health & Education activities are the result of public and private partnerships and the civic sector. The UNESCO Chair Secretariat is responsible for the management of the UNESCO chair. The ethical charter includes our ethical code and types of partnership.

Ethical code:

1. The UNESCO chair will make use of both public and private funding in order to realize its workplan and five core activities.
2. Any public or private partnership acknowledges the aim and objectives of the UNESCO chair as formulated on our website: <http://unescochair-ghe.org/wp-content/uploads/2018/04/Brochure-UNESCO-UNITWIN-April-2018.pdf>
3. Any public or private funding for realizing the UNESCO chair workplan will form part of a philanthropic commitment that will not influence the general aim and objectives of the UNESCO chair, and will not take advantage of students, their parents, school staff, and any other members of the school community.
4. No brands from private funding bodies may feature on UNESCO chair materials. No distribution of products of these private funding bodies may take place in schools or the local community in activities that are related to the UNESCO chair.
5. The UNESCO chair will make clear and transparent agreements and Memorandum of Understandings with public and private organisations about the partnership, the contract and agreements on visibility of the partner.
6. Support of the pharmaceutical companies comes from multiple competing sources and will be planned under the umbrella of the International Federation of Pharmaceutical Manufacturers and Associations.
7. For reasons of transparency the UNESCO chair will always make a public acknowledgement related to funding.
8. The UNESCO chair respects the WHO policy for interaction of WHO CCs with private sector entities as formulated in the WHO Guide for WHO Collaborating Centres ([http://www.who.int/collaboratingcentres/Guide for WHO collaborating centres 2017FINAL.pdf](http://www.who.int/collaboratingcentres/Guide%20for%20WHO%20collaborating%20centres%202017FINAL.pdf)).

3 types of partnership:

- A. **Beneficiary:** public or private organization that gives financial support or scientific support to the realization of one of the projects of the UNESCO chair. The beneficiary will be explicitly mentioned among the financial supporters of the UNESCO chair project.
- B. **Partner:** public or private organization that gives financial support (from € 15.000 per year) for scientific projects, transmission of knowledge or management of the Chair. They will be mentioned as one of the Partners of the chair on the UNESCO chair website.
- C. **Member:** public or private organization that gives financial support to one of the main five core activities of the chair, from €100.000 per year. The Member will be mentioned as one of the Chair Members on the UNESCO chair website. Visibility and commitment of the Chair Member will be described in a specific agreement.
