Looking at the past trends, is Morocco doing better or worse than expected?

Short answer: Morocco is exceeding expectations.

Between 1990 and 2017, 5,429 more survived pregnancy and childbirth than expected in Morocco.





Maternal Mortality Trends in Morocco: 2000 to 2017



Main causes of maternal deaths, 2000 and 2017



Avoidability of maternal deaths in 2015








Deliveries in health facilities



- Facility-Based delivery rate: 87% (DHS, 2018)
- Underutilization of birthing centers in Primary Healthcare (> 50% of Human Resources)
 - 6% of Birth centers are closed (Lack of Human Ressources)
 - Basic EmONC available in 42% Births
 Centers
 - Referrals to hospital maternities (Culture of blame and fear of punishment)



Other factors that contribute to reduce maternal mortality



- Improvement in living conditions (access to safe drinking water, sanitation, hygiene, electricity, transport and communication)
- Improving women's education and autonomy
- Delaying the marriage age
- Legislative and policy reforms to promote gender equality and women's empowerment
- Political stability


